

Introduction: 1st Sunday of Advent

Advent is a time of watchfulness. We are waiting for the final coming of Christ at the end of time. And we are also waiting for his coming to us at the time of our death. Since both times are hidden from us, we should maintain a state of watchfulness so that we are ready to meet the Lord at any moment.

Today's Readings:

First Reading: (Isaiah 63:16-17; 64:1.3-8)

The prophet recalls God's past goodness to his people, and pleads with him to save them from their present sinfulness.

Response to Psalm: GOD OF HOSTS BRING US BACK;

LET YOUR FACE SHINE ON US AND WE SHALL BE SAVED.

Second Reading: (1st Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 1:3-9)

As we await the coming of Christ in glory, the Holy Spirit keeps us steadfast in bearing witness to him.

<u>Gospel</u>: (Mark 13:33-37)

We need to stay awake at our appointed tasks, because we do not know the hour when Jesus, our Master, will return.

Hoping Against Hope: Friday 8 December. St Aloysius' Church, Garnethill. Following 5.30 p.m. Mass for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception Father Mathew Bomki of the St Aloysius Jesuit Community will lead an Advent Evening of Reflection and Prayer on Isaiah 11. Fr Bomki will look at the text from Isaiah in ways that connect the hopes and fears of the people in Isaiah's time and the times surrounding Jesus' birth with those of people today particularly in his home country of Cameroon. "The wolf lives with the lamb, the panther lies down with the kid, calf and lion feed together, with a little boy to lead them."
