# Introduction: 3rd Sunday of Easter - Year (B)

In the Gospel, we find the apostles gathered behind closed doors, wounded in heart and in spirit. But Jesus appears to them, gives them his peace, and breathes new life into them. He does the same for us. Let us open ourselves to the gifts the risen Lord wants to give us.

First Reading: (Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15. 17-19)

This reading is an early explanation of the Passion, and an example of the early witness to the resurrection.

Response to Psalm: LIFT UP THE LIGHT OF YOUR FACE ON US, O LORD.

Second Reading: (1st Letter of St. John 2:1-5)

We show that we know God by keeping his commandments. But when we fail, Christ intercedes for us with the Father.

Gospel: (Luke 24:35-48)

Jesus appears to the apostles, and commissions them to preach the Gospel to all nations.
