Introduction: "World Day of the Poor"

Thanks to the writers of the Gospels, the words of the Lord remain with us to this very day. They are with us to teach us, to guide us, to inspire us, to comfort us, and to challenge us. How well do we listen to his words, and how hard do we try to practise them in our lives?

Today's Readings:

First Reading: (Daniel 12:1-3) This is part of a vision of the prophet Daniel about the end of time. It introduces the belief in a resurrection of the dead and in retribution after death.

Response to Psalm: PRESERVE ME, GOD, I TAKE REFUGE IN YOU.

<u>Second Reading:</u> (Letter to the Hebrews 10:11-14.18) This reading insists on the superiority of Christ's sacrifice over all the sacrifices of the Old Law.

<u>Gospel:</u> (Mark 13:24-32) This talks about the second coming of Christ, the time of which is known only to God.

<u>**Assisted Dying Bill:</u> (***LESS THAN <u>TWO WEEKS</u> to stop assisted suicide***) <u>PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE IT TO OTHERS - DO YOUR BIT AND CONTACT YOUR MP.</u>

A Bill has been introduced to Parliament by Kim Leadbeater MP to legalise assisted suicide. This will be voted on by MPs on 29th November. We know that assisted suicide laws in other jurisdictions have had devastating consequences for the poor, disabled and marginalised. This is the biggest threat to the vulnerable in a decade, and <u>we need a huge effort to lobby MPs to vote against the Bill</u>. Please urgently contact your MP and ask him/her to vote against the Bill.
