Introduction: (Fourth Sunday of Advent (Year C)

In a few days, we celebrate the birthday of Christ. Christ comes, most readily, to those who realise their need of him. Let us draw near to him now, bringing with us our spiritual poverty, wounds, and sins.

Today's Readings:

First Reading: (Micah 5:2-5a) The prophet Micah announces to the beleaguered inhabitants of Jerusalem that a Ruler will come from Bethlehem who will bring them peace.

<u>Response to Psalm</u>: BRING US BACK, O GOD; LET YOUR FACE SHINE FORTH, AND WE SHALL BE SAVED.

<u>Second Reading:</u> (Hebrews 10:5-10) Jesus came, not to offer the sacrifices of the old law, but to do the will of God. His one perfect sacrifice replaced all the former sacrifices.

<u>Gospel:</u> (Luke 1:39-45) Elizabeth praises Mary, and, enlightened by the Holy Spirit, hints at the uniqueness of the child she has conceived.
