Introduction: (3rd Sunday of Easter)

Today's Readings:

<u>First Reading:</u> (Acts of the Apostles 5:27b-32.40b-41) We see the apostles courageously witnessing to the resurrection of Jesus and gladly suffering for it.

Response to Psalm: I WILL EXTOL YOU, LORD, FOR YOU HAVE RAISED ME UP.

<u>Second Reading:</u> (Revelation 5:11-14) We hear a hymn in praise of the crucified and risen Christ.

<u>Gospel:</u> (John 21:1-14) This relates an appearance of the risen Jesus to seven of his apostles by the Sea of Tiberias. The incident is built around Peter.
