Evening Prayer: Each Monday evening at 5.45pm, the Franciscan Community prays Evening Prayer in the church (Divine Office). All are welcome to join us. Evening Prayer is followed by Eucharistic adoration.

Introduction: (Feast of Saints Peter and Paul)

Today's readings recall the lows and highs of both their lives. Paul recalls how he had mercilessly persecuted the Church; his letters bear witness to his remarkable change to fearless preacher of the Risen Christ. Peter, despite denying three times he even knew Jesus, is given the title of Rock and the commission to be shepherd to Jesus' flock.

Today's Readings:

First Reading: (Acts 12:1-11)

King Herod arrests and persecutes members of the early church, killing James and imprisoning Peter. While the church prays fervently, an angel miraculously rescues Peter from prison. Peter is led past guards and locked gates, realising God has delivered him.

Response to Psalm: FROM ALL MY TERRORS THE LORD SET ME FREE.

Second Reading: (2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18)

Paul reflects on his faithful service, saying he has fought the good fight and awaits the crown of righteousness from the Lord. He acknowledges the Lord's strength and deliverance in his trials. Confident in God's protection, he trusts He will bring him safely to His heavenly kingdom.

Gospel: (Matthew 16:13-19) Jesus asks His disciples who people say He is, and Peter declares Him the Messiah, the Son of the living God. Jesus blesses Peter for his divine insight and declares him the rock on which He will build His Church. He gives Peter the keys of the kingdom, granting authority to bind and loose on earth and in heaven.

****Free Bread Friday:** A local bakery has offered the parish various breads and confectionary to distribute to those in need. Each Friday morning, between 10.45 and 12 noon, there will be items available for collection in the atrium. As no packaging is provided, please ensure you bring a suitable bag or container to take away your chosen items.

****AGAP:** The parish are hosting a play “Pilgrim of Hope” on the 15th August, 2025. Venue is our church hall. Tickets will be available soon, so keep watching this space.

****Recent voting on the Bills for Abortion and Assisted Suicide:** You will likely have heard the disappointing news from both votes last week on abortion and assisted suicide. However, the fight is far from over.

Abortion - Last Tuesday, MPs voted 379 to 137 in favour of Tonia Antoniazzi’s extreme abortion up to birth amendment. This was the first time this radical amendment has been debated in the Commons, with under two hours of discussion and no public consultation. The amendment, would change the law so it would no longer be illegal for women to perform their own abortions for any reason, including sex-selective purposes, and at any point up to and during birth, likely leading to an increase in the number of women performing dangerous late-term abortions at home. **But it is not law yet, so let us be doing everything in our power to fight this amendment in the House of Lords.**

Assisted Suicide - Last Friday, MPs voted at Third Reading by 314 votes to 291 in support of Kim Leadbeater’s assisted suicide Bill. This is a major drop-in support from November, when the Bill passed its Second Reading by 55 votes - it has now scraped through by just 23 votes.

We need to keep fighting this Bill at every stage in the House of Lords, where we are confident it can be overturned, given its continued loss of support.

Please click on the website www.righttolife.org.uk/uptobirthvote (it will take just 30 seconds) to launch a tool to help constituents check how their MP voted on the abortion up to birth vote and send a follow-up message - whether to thank them, express concerns or encourage them to vote the right way if/when the amendment/other abortion amendments return from the Lords, to be voted again in the Commons.
