#### Introduction: (18th Sunday - Year 'C')

Possessions exercise a big hold on our hearts. The result is that we forget the more important things in life. Jesus said our main concern should be to "make ourselves rich in the sight of God." In truth, all of us are poor before God. Let us reflect on that for a moment - it is only God who can truly enrich us.

# Today's Readings:

First Reading: (Book of Ecclesiastes 1:2: 2:21-23)

The things that are supposed to satisfy human beings do not satisfy them.

Response to Psalm: O LORD, YOU HAVE BEEN OUR REFUGE, FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION.

Second Reading: (Letter of St Paul to the Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11)

Through Baptism we share in the life of Christ. We hear some of the conclusions that follow from this.

Gospel: (Luke 12: 13-21)

Jesus warns against greed, and stresses the foolishness of depending on material things for one's security rather than on God.

# \*\*Franciscan Portiuncula Indulgence:

In 1216, at St. Francis' request, Pope Honorius III granted a plenary indulgence to those who visit the chapel in Assisi. Later popes expanded the indulgence to include any basilica, cathedral, or parish church.

An indulgence is the remission of the temporal punishment due to sins that have already been forgiven, and it can be plenary or partial.

A plenary indulgence requires that the individual be in the state of grace by the completion of the acts and have complete detachment from sin. The person must also sacramentally confess his or her sins and receive Communion up to about 20 days before or after the indulgenced act.

Anyone who visits a Catholic church with the intention of honouring Our Lady of the Angels and recites the Creed, the Our Father, and prays for the pope's intentions may receive a plenary indulgence on Aug. 2/3.

#### \*\*\* "Grandiosity and 'Poor Me': Two Sides of the Same Coin"

- In today's Gospel (Luke 12:13-21), Jesus tells of a rich man who builds bigger barns to store his wealth. He believes he is secure—until God calls him to account. Jesus warns: "One's life does not consist of possessions."
- In recovery circles (like A.A.), this attitude is often seen in two extremes: grandiosity and "poor me". Grandiosity says, "I do not need anyone. I've got this." The "poor me" says, "Nothing will ever get better for me." They seem different, but both are self-focused and out of alignment with God's truth.
- Jesus calls us to a middle path-humility. Not thinking less of ourselves, but thinking of ourselves less. Not puffed up or crushed down, but grounded in God's love.
- This week, whether you have tempted to take too much credit or wallow in defeat, remember: our worth isn't found in success or failure, but in being God's beloved. Let us aim not to build bigger barns—but to grow deeper trust.

# Prayer:

Lord, free me from the trap of thinking too much or too little of myself.

Teach me to live in Your truth—with humility, trust, and grace.

Help me let go of control and grow rich in what matters to You.
