Introduction: 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

In biblical times people did not touch lepers for fear of contagion. Yet Jesus reached out and touched lepers. He still reaches out to us. Let us approach the Lord now, realising that we need his healing touch.

Today's Readings:

First Reading: (Leviticus 13: 1-2. 44-46)

Lepers were considered ritually unclean and were compelled to live apart from the community.

Response to Psalm: YOU ARE MY REFUGE, O LORD;
YOU FILL ME WITH THE JOY OF SALVATION.

<u>Second Reading:</u> (1st letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians 10: 31-11:1) St. Paul urges us never to do anything offensive to anyone but to do everything for the glory of God.

Gospel: (Mark 1: 40-45)

This tells of the cure of a leper by Jesus.
