Introduction:

Today, as we begin a new liturgical year, the liturgy invites us to come to the house of God, so that God may teach us his ways and help us to walk in his light.

Today's Readings:

First Reading: (Isaiah 2:1-5)

This vision of a world at peace under God challenges Christians to work for this new world which as inaugurated by Christ.

Response to Psalm: LET US GO REJOICING TO THE HOUSE OF THE LORD.

Second Reading: (Romans 13: 11-14a)

This contains a wake-up call, and urges us to turn away from the darkness of evil, and to walk in the light of Christ.

Gospel: (Matthew 24: 37-44)

This Gospel urges us to stay awake because we do not know the day or the hour when Christ will return.
