"My Lord Jesus Christ, I implore you to enlighten me and to disperse the darkness of my soul. Give me true faith, firm hope and perfect Charity. Grant me, O Lord, to know you so well, that in all things I may act by your light and in accordance with your holy will." (St Francis' prayer for guidance)

Each Monday evening, and on every 1st Friday, from 5.45pm to 7pm, in the presence of the BLESSED SACRAMENT, the Franciscan Community prays Evening Prayer in the church (Divine Office). All are welcome to join in, and remain during EUCHARISTIC ADORATION, to experience the joy of being in the Lord's presence.

The next First Friday will be 5th DECEMBER, 2025.

Introduction: (Dedication of the Lateran Basilica)

Following the Emperor Constantine granting freedom of worship to the Catholic Church in 313, the church was built beside the palace of the Laterani family and consecrated in 324. This church is the cathedral of the diocese of Rome and, until 1309, the popes lived nearby. Its original dedication is to the Most Holy Saviour; in the Middle Ages, the names of St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist were added (thus a common name now is 'St. John Lateran'). The basilica bears the description: 'Omnium Urbis et Orbis terrarum Mater et Caput' (Of All the Churches in the City and in the World, the Mother and Head). This feast was extended worldwide to the whole Church in 1565.

Today's Readings:

First Reading: (Ezekiel 47: 1-2, 8-9, 12)

Water is a sign of life. The first reading gives a vision of the beauty and fruitfulness flowing from the Temple. The same is true of the Church.

Response to Psalm: THE WATERS OF A RIVER GIVE JOY TO GOD'S CITY, THE HOLY PLACE, THE ABODE OF THE MOST HIGH.

Second Reading: 1st Letter of St. Paul (1 Corinthians 3: 9c-11, 16-17)
In the bible there many images of the Church - a flock of sheep, a vineyard, a cultivated field, but here St. Paul uses the image of a building.

Gospel: (John 2: 13-22)

Jesus uses the word "Temple" to mean the temple that was his Body, the Church.

**Vulnerable at Risk: Holyrood's Health and Sport Committee has rejected a raft of amendments that would have strengthened safeguards in Liam McArthur's Assisted Dying for Terminally Ill Adults (Scotland) Bill. The amendments were designed to protect some of the most vulnerable people in our communities from being coerced into a premature death; disabled people, those with poor mental health, and people struggling with financial hardship. The committee will meet again next Tuesday to continue consideration of amendments.
