Introduction: 4th Sunday of Advent (Year A)

As we approach Christmas, the pace of things speed-up, so that the spiritual side tends to get lost. Let us pause to make room in our minds and hearts so that Christ may come to us during this Eucharist.

Today's Readings:

First Reading: (Isaiah 7: 10-14)

This reading foretells the birth of a very special child - a child who will be called

Emmanuel, that is: God-with-us.

Response to Psalm: LET THE LORD ENTER; HE IS THE KING OF GLORY.

Second Reading: (St. Paul to the Romans 1: 1-7)

These opening lines from Paul's letter to the Romans draw attention to the human and divine 'roots' of Jesus.

Gospel: (Matthew 1: 18-24)

This shows how the prophecy of Isaiah was fulfilled in Jesus.

THANKSGIVING PRAYER AFTER HOLY COMMUNION

Jesus, my God, You are now in me and I in You.

May we always be close to You and to each other, as children of one family.
